REPORT FROM THE DISABLED STUDENTS GROUP (DSG)

Committee

There has been some change in committee members with the resignation of 2 officers, Chair and PR and Comms, and the co-opt of 3 more committee members.

Our thanks and gratitude go out to Sheila and Colin for all the work they have done for the Disabled Students Group.

There are currently 3 Acting Officers, and 6 other committee members.

Megan Brown was co-opted as Acting Chair with effect of 1st June 2019

Whilst previously unreported, Chris Hughes was co-opted as Acting Secretary and Marilin Salström as Acting PR and Comms with effect of 10th March 2019.

A couple of very successful committee meetings have taken place, and lots of fresh ideas have come forward, and they will be included later in this report. The last month has been a very steep learning curve for all the committee.

Participation

CAN conference, JISC. There was a presentation by Disabled Students on Accessibility and another on Diversity, presented by Billy Docherty (DSG Committee Member and FASS FAR) and Cherry Day (VP Equality and Diversity). This was particularly well received and as a result, Billy and Cherry have been invited to be keynote speakers at the Bloomsbury Institute for Teaching and Learning Conference on 8th and 9th July.

Ed ICT. Several Group and Committee Members attended this Conference, gaining more insight and picking up pointers for us to take forward.

Disabled Veteran Students Workshop. We had a Committee Member attend and present at this event.

Community drop-ins and Meet-ups. Group and Committee Members continue to attend these events helping students and promoting the Association and D.S.G.

So, what's next; In addition to the day to day support, and signposting we give to students, the D.S.G. Committee will also be representing and helping students as follows:

The Bloomsbury Institute Conference. July 8th and 9th. Billy and Cherry will be keynote speakers at this event.

I.A.G (Information and Guidance) Conference. July 15th. Some of the committee will be attending this day conference.

Inclusion Meeting. July 18th. Megan as Acting Chair will be attending.

Website survey. We will be putting a survey out to students asking for feedback on how they would like us to be representing them and for website content ideas and also possible ideas for merchandise, etc.

Recruitment. Committee is currently running at 4 members light, and we are going to be asking for more volunteers to join committee.

Regions. Exploring the possibilities of regional Meet-ups, or further engagement through existing meet-ups.

Training. Training for officers is being arranged, enabling us to better represent and support students.

Freshers. Discussions for Freshers events take place at next committee meeting. August 7th.
